## On Saturday, June 7, at Detroit's Blessed Sacrament Cathedral Cardinal Maida to Ordain Six Men to the Priesthood

Cardinal Adam Maida, archbishop of Detroit, will ordain six men to the Catholic priesthood at 10 a.m. on Saturday, June 7, in the newly-renovated Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, located at 9844 Woodward Avenue, between Grand Boulevard and Davison, in Detroit.

Approximately 700 priests currently serve the 1.4 million Catholics living in the six counties of the Archdiocese of Detroit. In the last five years, the Archdiocese of Detroit has been averaging five ordinations per year.

A survey conducted by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Vocations Committee indicates that, nationwide, approximately 500 men will be ordained to the Catholic priesthood this year.

Those being ordained for ministry in the Archdiocese of Detroit are: **John Bustamante, Paul Czarnota, Pawel Kaczmarczyk, Robert Liberty Jr., James McNulty, and Anthony Richter.**

**John Bustamante**, 39, is the son of Anthony and Cecelia Bustamante. His home parish is the Church of the Divine Child in Dearborn.

**Paul Czarnota**, 40, is the son of John and Alice Czarnota. His home parish is the San Francesco Catholic Community in Clinton Township.

**Pawel Kaczmarczyk**, 26, is the son of Andrzej and Maria Kaczmarczyk of Plock, Poland. His home parish is St. Frances Cabrini, Allen Park.

**Robert Liberty Jr.**, 33, is the son of Robert and Kathalene Liberty. His home parish is St. Joan of Arc in St. Clair Shores.

**James McNulty**, 48, is the son of Elwood and Doris McNulty. His home parish is St. Margaret of Scotland in St. Clair Shores.

**Anthony Richter**, 38, is the son of Clement and Mary Richter. His home parish is All Saints in Detroit.
