Cardinal Maida to Introduce Bishops-Elect Hurley, Quinn and Reiss at News Conference Three New Auxiliary Bishops for the Archdiocese of Detroit

His Holiness Pope John Paul II has named Monsignor Walter Hurley, Monsignor John Quinn and Father Frank Reiss (pronounced *Rees*) as new auxiliary bishops for the Archdiocese of Detroit. Ordination of the Bishops-elect will take place on Tuesday, August 12, at Detroit's newly renovated Blessed Sacrament Cathedral.

Monsignor Hurley, 66, has served for the past 13 years as pastor of Our Lady of Sorrows Parish, Farmington. Monsignor John Quinn, 57, has served for the past 13 years as director of the Department of Education of the Archdiocese of Detroit. Father Frank Reiss, 62, has served for the past 5 years as pastor of St. Frances Cabrini Parish, Allen Park.

The new bishops will join fellow Detroit Auxiliary Bishops Moses Anderson, S.S.E.; Leonard Blair; Earl Boyea; Thomas Gumbleton; and Walter Schoenherr. Cardinal Adam Maida, archbishop of Detroit, serves as chief shepherd for the 1.46 million Catholics of the Archdiocese of Detroit who reside in Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Monroe, Lapeer and St. Clair Counties.
