On Saturday, May 26, at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral Cardinal Maida to Ordain Deacon Camilleri to the Priesthood

Cardinal Adam Maida, archbishop of Detroit, will ordain Deacon Anthony J. Camilleri to the priesthood in a ceremony at 10 a.m. on Saturday, May 26, at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, 9844 Woodward Avenue, Detroit. The ordination is open to the public. A reception will follow on the cathedral grounds.

Camilleri, 30, is the son of Anthony E. and the late Katherine Elizabeth Camilleri. His home parish is Holy Spirit in Highland Township. He attended elementary and middle school in Farmington and is a graduate of St. Mary's Prep in Orchard Lake.

Camilleri holds a Bachelor of Science in health, fitness and cardiac rehabilitation from Central Michigan University, Mount Pleasant, and a Master of Divinity from Sacred Heart Major Seminary, Detroit.

Camilleri will celebrate Masses of Thanksgiving at 11 a.m. on May 27 at Shrine Chapel of Our Lady of Orchard Lake, Orchard Lake Village; at 11 a.m. on June 3 at Holy Spirit Church, Highland Township; at 7:15 a.m. on June 10 at St. Patrick Mission, Clifford; at 9:15 a.m. on June 10 at St. Mary Burnside Church, Burnside Township; at 11 a.m. on June 10 at SS. Peter and Paul Church, North Branch; at 4 p.m. on June 16 at St. Stephen Church, Port Huron; and at 11 a.m. on June 17 at St. Joseph Church, Port Huron.
