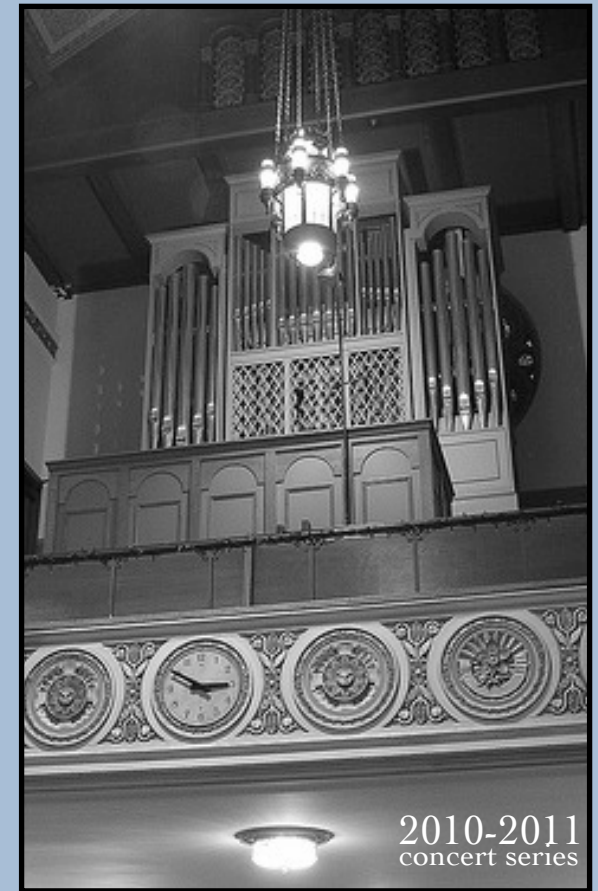

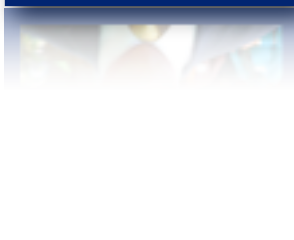


Louis Canter

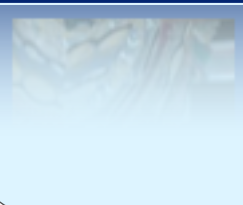


Douglas Scott
